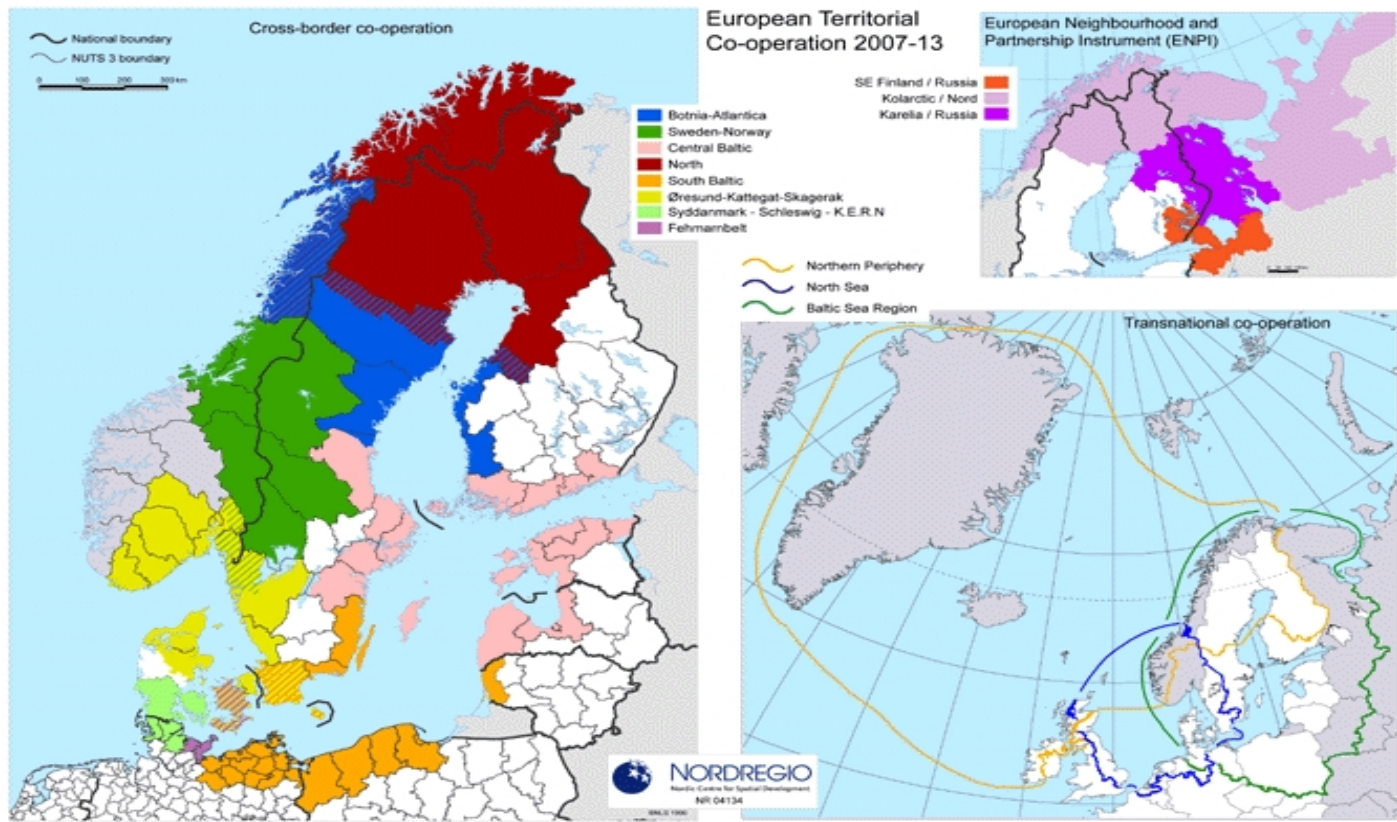

European territorial co-operation (ETC) 2007-2013

- The new objective promotes crossborder, transnational and interregional cooperation in the EU.
- Based on the earlier INTERREG community initiative
 - territorial cooperation objective only between the EU member states
 - cooperation on the external borders moved to ENPI or IPA programmes
- Total financing 7.75 bn€ from the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) = 2.52 % of structural funds resources
 - 74 % crossborder cooperation A strand (incl. ENPI and IPA CBC)
 - 21 % transnational cooperation B strand
 - 5 % interregional cooperation C strand
- Finland –A and B strands 120.2 m€ from ERDF (39.6 m€ allocated to the ENPI CBC programmes)

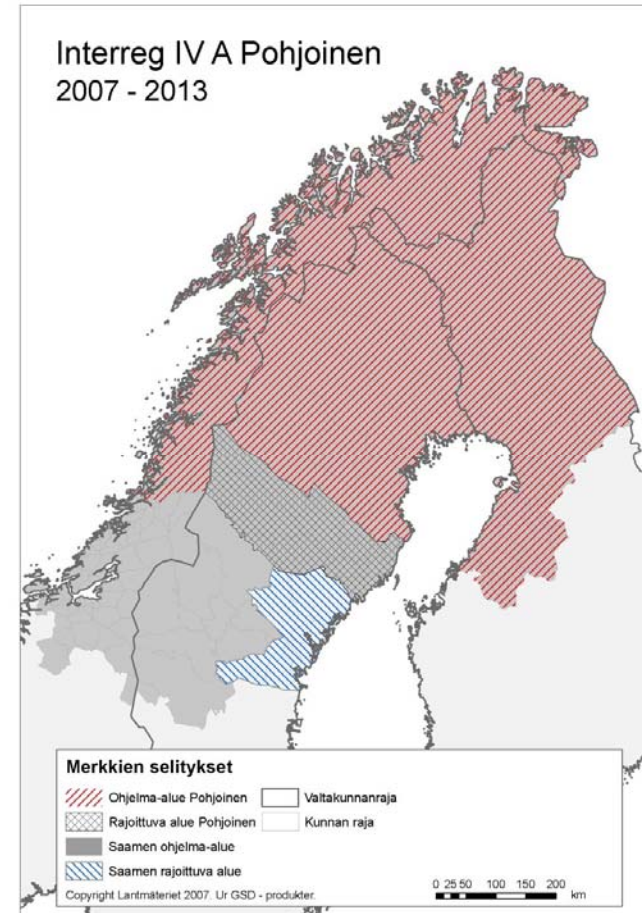

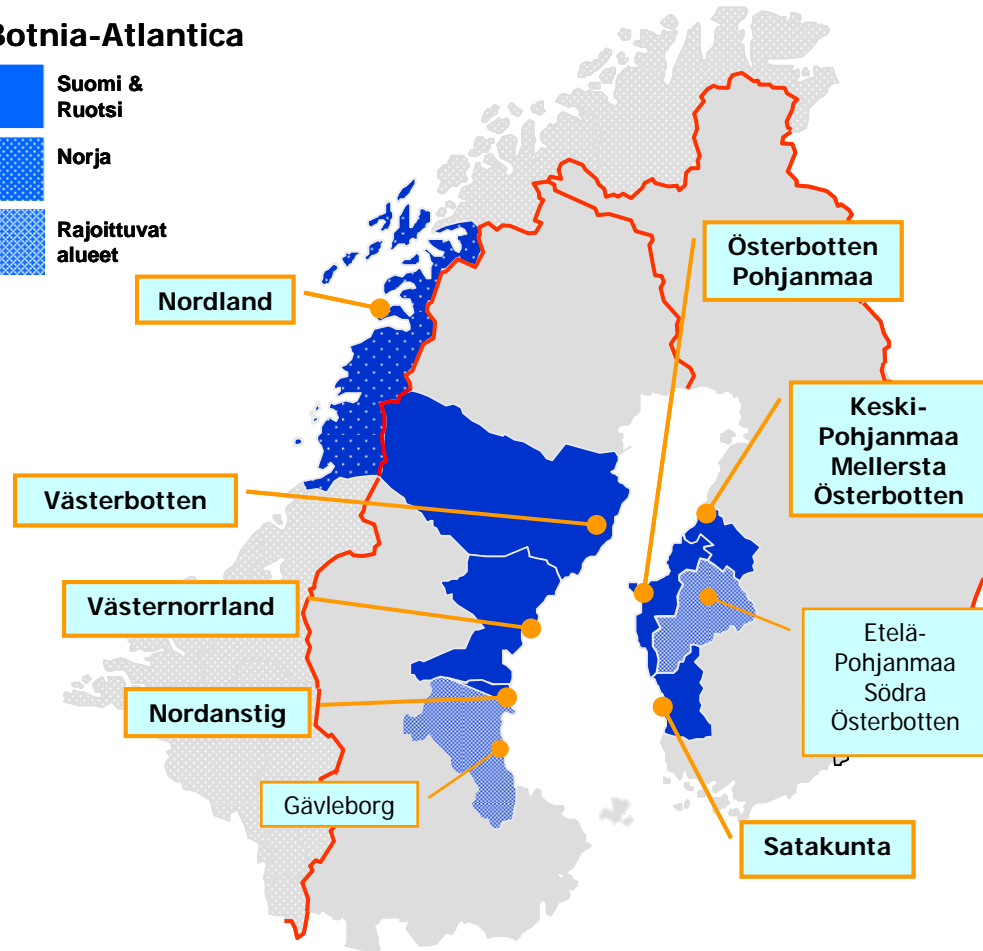

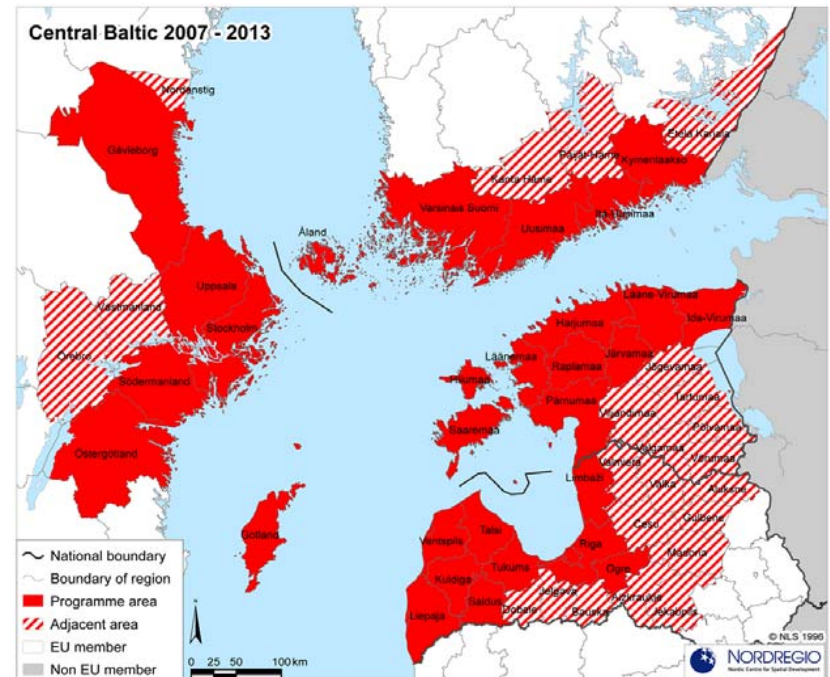

- Archipelago and islands sub-programme (AI)



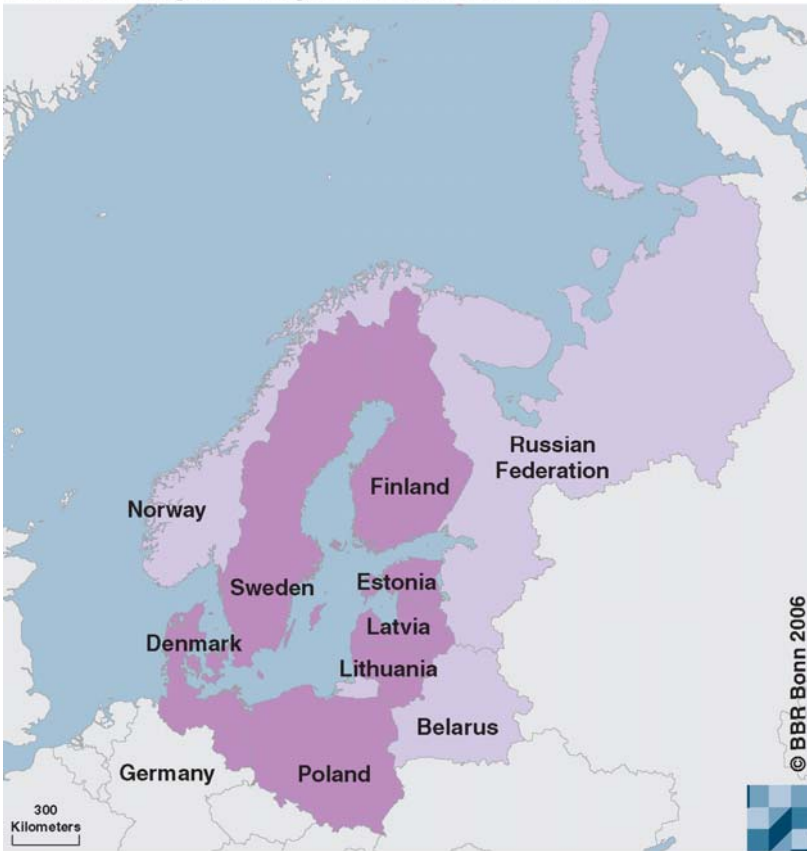
